The Howard County Zoning Board hearing on the Village Center Redevelopment Proposal was held on July 24. The Zoning Board was not able to get through the entire process in one evening, so the hearing will continue on **Wednesday, September 4, 2019 at 6:30 pm** at the George Howard Building in Ellicott City. This will be a public hearing where testimony can be given by the general public. **If you did not attend the first night, you can still sign up to testify at the September 4 hearing.** 

Please be aware that there is a good possibility that the hearing may continue for a third night to accommodate the testimony. Learn how to create and maintain beautiful landscapes that require less mowing and few chemical inputs and that can also provide good habitat for pollinators at a FREE seminar on **Wednesday, September 16, 7-9 pm** at The Hawthorn Center.
