Downtown Columbia Walkability Study

The Downtown Columbia Partnership (DTC) launched a project to assess walkability in Downtown Columbia and they want to hear from you.

DTC has created a short survey and interactive map for you to help inform the project team of existing issues and concerns as they prepare for a series of on-site evaluations of existing pedestrian conditions.

Your feedback will help the project team identify walking routes for our on-site visits and refine a set of short-term and long-term recommendations for improving pedestrian comfort and safety in the area.




Patuxent Commons Pre-Submission Community Meeting

Keep Storm Drains Clear

As homeowners, we are responsible for the trees on our property. That means when trees decide to lose their leaves, we are responsible for where they go. You may think "if the leaves are in the street, it's not my problem."

Except, they are your problem. Too many leaves blocking a storm drain can cause flooding during heavy rainfalls, leading to impassable streets, safety hazards and possibly property damage.

To keep your community safe:

- 1. DON'T sweep leaves into the street.
- 2. DO use a leaf rake to remove leaves from on top and sides of the storm drain entry points. Add them to your green bin for collection and composting.
- 3. If you see flooding in your streets due to clogged storm drains try to pull the leaves onto the curb out of the way of the water.
- 4. If flooding is too great and you can not safely clear the drain, place a ticket in TellHoCo
 - (https://seeclickfix.com/web_portal/Kkh6qLcSRJDMcnYqo7usKCQR/report/category/5273/location) so the county can come out and professionally clean the storm drain.



CA Rain Gardens are Back!!

Does your residential property have water problems during and immediately after a rain storm, water seeping into your basement, streams of water across your lawn, soggy soil for days after the storm, plants getting so waterlogged that they die?

If so, please contact The Hickory Ridge Community Association at

events@hickoryridgevillage.org and the staff will put you in touch with the village's Watershed Advisory Committee. One or more members of the committee will assess your yard's situation and provide advice on how to deal with the water.

The advice tends to be on no/low cost solutions, one of which might be a CA rain garden. CA rain gardens can capture a lot of water allowing it to infiltrate into your lawn, while feeding a lovely garden and a grant from the state pays 75% of the cost while a professional gardening team digs, fills and plants the garden for you!
