We have all seen trees in our neighborhoods being smothered in English ivy or strangled by large vines. Winter is the easiest time to remove invasive ivy and other vines because most of the surrounding foliage has died back, leaving these vines exposed.

In this interactive webinar with professionals in sustainable landscape management, you will learn to identify common invasive (and native!) vines and plants by their winter appearance, as well as how to effectively remove the invasive ones.



Merry Mulch Recycle Your Holiday Tree

December 26 - January 20 Help keep thousands of trees out of the landfill.

Live trees are taken to our composting facility at Alpha Ridge Landfill to be recycled into compost and mulch. Artificial trees with metal components can be recycled in the scrap metal area at Alpha Ridge Landfill.

Tree Collection Tips

For County Residents with Yard Trim Collection.

If you are not sure if you receive yard trim service, call 410-313-6444

- Set your tree out the night before. (Trees are picked up by the yard trim truck, as early as 6 a.m. or as late as 5 p.m.)
- Remove all tinsel, garland, ornaments, lights, tree stands, plastic bags, etc.
- Trees must be cut into less than 4 foot lengths and tied. Bundles must weigh less than 40 pounds.

Missed the Merry Mulch Drop-Off?

You can still recycle your tree at the Alpha Ridge Wood Waste Area Monday through Saturday, 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. (No plastic bags)

Interested in being a 2024 Lifeguard?

It's cold outside, but CA's already thinking about summer! All lifeguard candidates for the 2024 season, whether new or experienced, need to complete our Water Screening test as part of their certification.

To help prepare applicants, Columbia Association is offering three Water Screening Walk-throughs at the Columbia Swim Center between November and January.

What is the Water Screening Test?

Water Screening includes:

- an untimed 200-yard swim (8 lengths),
- retrieval of a 10 lb. brick from the diving well (approximately 11 feet), and
- a two-minute water tread with hands out of the water.

Get Practice & Help From Instructors

These events will allow those interested in becoming a lifeguard to practice the test and meet with our certified instructors for tips and skill tutorials.

Sessions start promptly at 6:00 pm and run until 7:00 pm.

- Own and occupy the home as your principal residence
- Can be single family, townhouse or condo
- All mortgage, property taxes, HOA/condo fees, and hazard insurance payments must be current

Loan Terms

- Maximum loan amount is \$40,000
- Interest rate shall not exceed 2%
- Maximum term is 30 years

Letter of Compliance

If you are putting your house on the market, request a Letter of Compliance from the Village Office well in advance of a pending settlement date. This letter is not required, but it is a valuable tool for sellers because it verifies that your property is in compliance with the Hickory Ridge Covenants. Any covenant violations on your property become the responsibility of the new owner, so home buyers often request a Letter of Compliance from the Seller. 




