# The Hickory Ridge Community Association Annual Meeting/Election

The Hickory Ridge Community Association Annual Meeting/Election begins on Saturday, April 20, 2024, at 9:00 am with the collecting of votes. Vote collection ends at 12:00pm, at which time the Village Board will meet.

If the number of votes cast in this election are insufficient to constitute a quorum or if there is a tie in the race for a Village Board seat or the Columbia Council seat, a second election will be called in accordance with Section 11B-111(6)(i) of the Maryland Homeowners Association Act and Section 1.05 of the Association's By-Laws. If required, a second election will be held on Saturday, May 4, 2024, from 9:00 am - 12:00 pm.



# Who is eligible?

- You must be a Howard County homeowner
- Own and occupy the home as your principal residence
- Can be single family, townhouse or condo
- All mortgage, property taxes, HOA/condo fees, and hazard insurance payments must be current

# **Loan Terms**

- Maximum loan amount is \$40,000
- Interest rate shall not exceed 2%
- Maximum term is 30 years

### **Letter of Compliance**

If you are putting your house on the market, request a Letter of Compliance from the Village Office well in advance of a pending settlement date. This letter is not required, but it is a valuable tool for sellers because it verifies that your property is in compliance with the Hickory Ridge Covenants. Any covenant violations on your property become the responsibility of the new owner, so home buyers often request a Letter of Compliance from the Seller. Request forms are
