What Is Happening at the Corner of Cedar Lane and Freetown Road?

The Patuxent Commons project concept was developed by the Howard County Autism Society to help address housing needs of adults with disabilities.

What is the Patuxent Commons concept?

Patuxent Commons is an intentional, supportive community for people of all ages, abilities, and incomes planned for Hickory Ridge. It has four primary objectives:

- 1. Address housing instability faced by low-income adults with disabilities, older adults, and younger adults/families
- Enhance social connectedness through building of relationships and community engagement, and reciprocal sharing of social support by neighbors
- 3. Use housing as a springboard to maximize individual potential and facilitate community integration for people of all ages, abilities and incomes
- 4. Pioneer a viable, innovative solution to the growing housing crisis facing adults with disabilities that can be adapted elsewhere in Maryland and serve as a model for similar housing developments throughout the United States.

Freetown Farm Plant & Produce Sales

Join the staff at Freetown Farm every Saturday from 9am - 1pm at Freetown Farm (8000 Harriet Tubman Ln, Columbia), where they will have beautiful plants and farm fresh produce for sale throughout the summer!

Each week, Freetown Farm will have a different activity open to all visitors. So far, they've had a scavenger hunt, a lesson on seeds, a seed giveaway and flower pressing.

When you support CEI's Agroecology in Action program, it directly impacts their ability to provide more fresh, nutritious produce to those in need. Last year they were able to distribute 5,500 pounds of produce, which is the equivalent of ten school buses full of food!

Housing Repair Program

Who is eligible?

- You must be a Howard County homeowner
- Own and occupy the home as your principal residence
- Can be single family, townhouse or condo
- All mortgage, property taxes, HOA/condo fees, and hazard insurance payments must be current

Loan Terms

- Maximum loan amount is \$40,000
- Interest rate shall not exceed 2%
- Maximum term is 30 years

Letter of Compliance

If you are putting your house on the market, request a Letter of Compliance from the Village Office well in advance of a pending settlement date. This letter is not required, but it is a valuable tool for sellers because it verifies that your property is in compliance with the Hickory Ridge Covenants. Any covenant violations on your property become the responsibility of the new owner, so home buyers often request a Letter of Compliance from the Seller.
