Tips to Help Prevent Auto Theft and Theft from Auto Howard County Police Department

Year-round, thieves target vehicles to either steal them or steal from them. These reports can increase when the weather warms, during holiday season, or whenever an individual or group targets neighborhoods in Howard County. These crimes occur in a variety of neighborhoods, but thieves typically target high-density residential areas, typically during the overnight to early-morning hours. We encourage you to report any theft from vehicle to police, including if your vehicle has been tampered with but nothing has been stolen. This helps us track trends and identify suspects. You can make a report <u>online</u> or by calling the non-emergency number at 410-313-2200. For thefts in progress, call 911.

You can take steps to make yourself less likely to be

victimized. Here's how:

- Always lock your vehicle. In some cases thieves break car windows, but often, they bypass locked vehicles after checking the door handles. We have seen this on home security camera video residents have provided to officers.
- Do not leave keys or key fobs inside your vehicle or leave your vehicle running unattended. We have seen "jump-in" vehicle thefts in which a thief steals a vehicle left running at a gas station or in a driveway. But a majority of other vehicle thefts occur because keys or key fobs are left in a vehicle.
- Do not leave valuables in plain sight, or in your car at all even for a brief time. We have seen thieves steal from vehicles at gas stations while the victim is inside the business. Wallets, purses, and electronics such as laptops and tablets are the most common valuables stolen. Thieves will use a stolen credit card as soon as they can, often to purchase gift cards.
- Park in a well-lit area or inside your garage if you have one and close your garage doors. Thieves have entered open garages and stolen vehicles and items out of vehicles.
- Additional security measures, such as vehicle tracking system/ GPS, vehicle security systems, and a steering wheel/column lock also can be effective deterrents.

Additional protections include:

• Get your VIN etched. Have HCPD engrave your car's VIN on all major pieces of glass. This is a free event offered by HCPD.

Check the calendar for dates/times.

- Register for "Watch Your Car." This free, voluntary vehicle registration program, administered by the Maryland Vehicle Theft Prevention Council, is designed to deter auto theft and assist in the apprehension of thieves. For more information about the "Watch Your Car" program, go to <u>Maryland State Police</u> website.
- Report a lost fob. If you lose a key fob, immediately contact the dealership to get a reprogrammed one, otherwise the lost fob will still allow a thief access to your vehicle.
- Use Transaction Safe Place. Need a safe place to handle a transaction you arranged online, such as the sale of a car or motorcycle? Designated parking spaces, marked with yellow signs, are available at both HCPD district stations and the community outreach building. These areas are video recorded 24/7/365.

Fall Leaves Quick Tip!

Cleaning up autumn leaves doesn't have to be a big chore. Turn that mound of leaves into beneficial mulch and feel good about doing your part to turn waste into a usable product that nurtures your garden and keeps nutrients out of our lakes and streams.

- Start by raking the leaves out of your shrub or flowerbeds. The object is to get all of the leaves onto a grassy or otherwise flat surface.
- Use the lawn mower to chop the leaves into smaller pieces.
- Gather up the leaf mulch and apply to your flower and shrub beds, natural areas or vegetable garden. The mulch can be applied several times over the season but you shouldn't let the depth exceed four inches at any one time.

- Maximum loan amount is \$40,000
- Interest rate shall not exceed 2%
- Maximum term is 30 years

Letter of Compliance

If you are putting your house on the market, request a Letter of Compliance from the Village Office well in advance of a pending settlement date. This letter is not required, but it is a valuable tool for sellers because it verifies that your property is in compliance with the Hickory Ridge Covenants. Any covenant violations on your property become the responsibility of the new owner, so home buyers often request a Letter of Compliance from the Seller. 
