



Keep Storm Drains Clear

Storm drains need to be clear to function and we can all help out!

- 1. Use a leaf rake to remove leaves from on top and sides of the storm drain entry points. Add them to your green bin for collection and composting.
- 2. If you see flooding in your streets due to clogged storm drains try to pull the leaves onto the curb out of the way of the water.
- If flooding is too great and you can not safely clear the drain, place a ticket in <u>TellHoCo</u> so the county can come out and clear the storm drain.

A Community of Families in Nature (CFIN) provides opportunities for families to come together in community in order to explore, learn, and play in nature.

Our Event Leaders plan engaging activities and collaborate with local partners; families just need to show up ready for a few hours outdoors.

We offer a Family Nature Club (best suited for families with kids ages 5-10, but all ages welcome) and a Nature Play-group called Seedlings, intended for ages 2-5 with a caregiver (younger siblings welcome). Our Family Nature Club holds two Sunday afternoon adventures a month. Our Seedlings programming takes place bi-weekly on Friday or Sunday mornings (can be combined for weekly programming). Most of our events take place within 15-20 minutes of downtown Columbia, including at our two properties: Freetown Farm and the Green Farmacy Garden.

Merry Mulch Recycle Your Holiday Tree

December 26, 2024 - January 18, 2025

Help keep thousands of trees out of the landfill.

Live trees are taken to our composting facility at Alpha Ridge Landfill to be recycled into compost and mulch. Artificial trees with metal components can be recycled in the scrap metal area at Alpha Ridge Landfill.

Tree Collection Tips

For County Residents with Yard Trim Collection.

If you are not sure if you receive yard trim service, call 410-313-6444

- Set your tree out the night before. (Trees are picked up by the yard trim truck, as early as 6 a.m. or as late as 5 p.m.)
- Remove all tinsel, garland, ornaments, lights, tree stands, plastic bags, etc.
- Trees must be cut into less than 4 foot lengths and tied. Bundles must weigh less than 40 pounds.

Missed the Merry Mulch Drop-Off?

You can still recycle your tree at the Alpha Ridge Wood Waste Area Monday through Saturday, 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. (No plastic bags)

- Own and occupy the home as your principal residence
- Can be single family, townhouse or condo
- All mortgage, property taxes, HOA/condo fees, and hazard insurance payments must be current

Loan Terms

- Maximum loan amount is \$40,000
- Interest rate shall not exceed 2%
- Maximum term is 30 years

Letter of Compliance

If you are putting your house on the market, request a Letter of Compliance from the Village Office well in advance of a pending settlement date. This letter is not required, but it is a valuable tool for sellers because it verifies that your property is in compliance with the Hickory Ridge Covenants. Any covenant violations on your property become the responsibility of the new owner, so home buyers often request a Letter of Compliance from the Seller.
