

Donate first! If you have working holiday lights, consider taking them to Goodwill or Salvation Army or posting them for free on <u>Freecycle</u>, <u>Facebook</u> <u>Marketplace</u> or <u>Nextdoor</u>.

Holiday lights should NOT go in your curbside recycling. These "tanglers" get wrapped around recycling equipment and jam the screens at the processor. Please recycle your holiday lights correctly through these drop-off and mail-in programs.

Merry Mulch Recycle Your Holiday Tree

December 26, 2024 - January 18, 2025

Help keep thousands of trees out of the landfill.

Live trees are taken to our composting facility at Alpha Ridge Landfill to be recycled into compost and mulch. Artificial trees with metal components can be recycled in the scrap metal area at Alpha Ridge Landfill.

Tree Collection Tips

For County Residents with Yard Trim Collection.

If you are not sure if you receive yard trim service, call 410-313-6444

- Set your tree out the night before. (Trees are picked up by the yard trim truck, as early as 6 a.m. or as late as 5 p.m.)
- Remove all tinsel, garland, ornaments, lights, tree stands, plastic bags, etc.
- Trees must be cut into less than 4 foot lengths and tied. Bundles must weigh less than 40 pounds.

Missed the Merry Mulch Drop-Off?

You can still recycle your tree at the Alpha Ridge Wood Waste Area Monday through Saturday, 8 a.m. - 4 p.m. (No plastic bags)

Who is eligible?

- You must be a Howard County homeowner
- Own and occupy the home as your principal residence
- Can be single family, townhouse or condo
- All mortgage, property taxes, HOA/condo fees, and hazard insurance payments must be current

Loan Terms

- Maximum loan amount is \$40,000
- Interest rate shall not exceed 2%
- Maximum term is 30 years

Letter of Compliance

If you are putting your house on the market, request a Letter of Compliance from the Village Office well in advance of a pending settlement date. This letter is not required, but it is a valuable tool for sellers because it verifies that your property is in compliance with the Hickory Ridge Covenants. Any covenant violations on your property become the responsibility of the new owner, so home buyers often request a Letter of Compliance from the Seller.
