National Nitrate Pollution Awareness Week is July 26 thru August 1st.

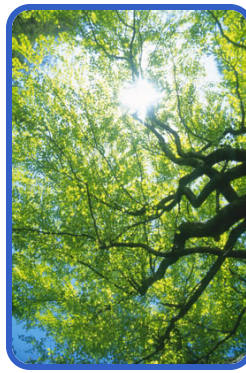
Nitrate is a naturally occurring compound made up of nitrogen and oxygen which is essential for plants.

Unfortunately, human activities (e.g., lawn and plant fertilization, pet waste, poorly maintained septic systems) add more nitrogen than plants and soils can use or retain.

Since nitrate is soluble in water, rain and irrigation can wash nitrate into our waterways or allow it to soak into groundwater.

Excess nitrate not only impacts our environment (algal blooms, fish kills, and “dead zones” like the one in our Chesapeake Bay), it also poses a serious risk to human health. Cancer, thyroid disease, and birth defects can all be caused by consumption of drinking water containing high nitrate levels.

ADOPT A TREE OR THREE

We Need Volunteers!

Many of us walk the CA pathways for exercise and to enjoy our natural

habitat. For those who walk in Clemens Crossing, please be aware that Columbia Association arranged for new trees to be planted along the pathway that runs from HRBR10 to Cardinal Lane in Clemens Crossing. This grant funded project is a collaboration between Howard EcoWorks and Columbia Association. Students already worked with EcoWorks during spring break to remove invasive plants in the area. Subsequently over 50 moisture tolerant trees were planted including bald cypress, sycamore, witch hazel, black gum, and pin oak. The objective of this work was to reforest the area since multiple trees had been removed due to disease.

Now we need a few volunteers who can help maintain the trees. We would ask for two or three visits to your adopted tree/trees across the year to remove any tall grass or weeds at the tree base or invasive vines that try to creep up the wire cage and strangle the tree. If you would be willing to help please send your contact information to CARES@hickoryridgevillage.org. We will contact you for an information session so you know how best to maintain your adoptee(s).

Our Wildlife Neighbors

The Red Fox

Vulpes Vulpes

You may have seen these four legged friends rooming around your cul-de-sac, dashing across the CA bike paths, or heard the cacophony of their high-pitched screeches late at night. The Red Fox, (scientific name Vulpes Vulpes) is found all across North America. It was previously believed that populations of Red Foxes only flourished post European settlement, however recent DNA studies suggest these populations grew due to relocation of Foxes native to North America.

Red Fox typically are, as their name would suggest—red, with a white underbelly and tip of the tail, and black ears and legs. Red Fox inhabiting high latitude regions typically have darker and thicker coats, whereas foxes inhabiting warmer climates typically don't have such vibrant fur. Some Red Foxes aren't even red! There are numerous subspecies, some with black coats, and some with silver coats.

Particularly in suburban environments, Foxes are often observed out during the daytime. While primarily nocturnal or crepuscular (meaning they're mainly active during twilight/dusk) they're not exclusively. It is not uncommon or uncharacteristic for Red Foxes to be seen out in neighborhoods or open fields during the day.



Who Takes Care of What??

The Village office receives anonymous reports of concerns about a lot of different issues. Often, they are concerns that can be addressed by the Village, but we also get reports of issues that we cannot address.

The Village **Covenants** empower the Covenant Advisor to address problems like unmowed grass, peeling paint and bulk items in a yard. However, the Covenant Advisor is limited by the Covenants as well.

Some issues that ARE NOT included in the Covenants, which would be addressed by other agencies are:

- Pet issues (off leash, waste etc.) - **Howard County Animal Control**
- Trees between the sidewalk and the street - **Bureau of Highways**
- Street issues like pot holes or a sign down - **Bureau of Highways**
- Columbia Association Open Space (paths, bridges, tot lots, playgrounds) - **open.space@columbiaassociation.org**
- Street light outage - **BGE reporting tool**

Some issues are on HOA property. If you live in a townhome or condo community, your HOA would handle the following:

- parking issues
- mailbox issues
- trash or trash cans on islands/collection points
- carports
- common property of the HOA

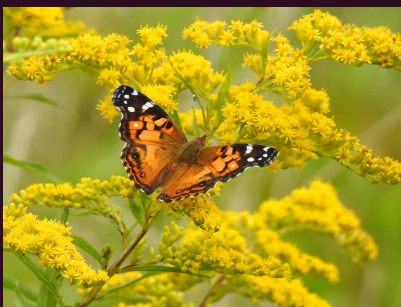


Bridge Closure

As a Columbia Cardholder, you'll get discounts at CA's pools, tennis courts, and golf courses, as well as on group fitness classes and kids' programs.

SUMMER BONUS: Columbia Cardholders receive 4 single-use guest passes per family on their Columbia Cardholder accounts. These guest passes are automatically added. The passes can be used at any of CA's 23 outdoor pools throughout the summer, Monday – Thursday only (excluding Holidays). They cannot be used at other Columbia Association facilities or programs.

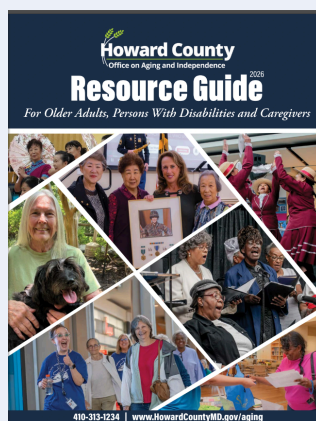

2026 HoCo Resource Guide For Older Adults Now Available

Howard County residents are embracing new opportunities to live longer and thrive, and the **Office on Aging & Independence** (OAI) helps ensure those added years are healthy, connected and secure.

With this in mind, they've updated the **Resource Guide for Older Adults, Adults with Disabilities and Caregivers** with programs and services for older adults of all ages and abilities, including wellness and prevention programs, caregiver and benefits support, nutrition and housing options, dementia-friendly initiatives, transportation, and opportunities to stay active and engaged.

Letter of Compliance

If you are putting your house on the market, request a Letter of Compliance well in advance of a settlement date. It's best to make the request when the house is put on the market. This letter is not required, but it is a valuable tool for sellers because it verifies that your property is in compliance with the Hickory Ridge Covenants. Any covenant violations on your property become the responsibility of the new owner, so home buyers often request a Letter of Compliance from the Seller.
